

**TOWN OF LAKESIDE**  
**DOUGLAS COUNTY, WISCONSIN**  
**SPECIAL TOWN BOARD MEETING – ANNUAL ROAD SURVEY**  
**April 30, 2026**

The Town of Lakeside Town Board conducted the Annual Road Survey on Wednesday, April 30, 2026, beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Town Hall pursuant to the posted agenda.

Present during the road survey portion were Chairperson Gary Peterson, Supervisor Gerald Tutor, Equipment Operator Mark Saari, and Clerk Jon Winter.

The board traveled from the Town Hall to Old Highway 13, which was observed to be in good condition. Pukema Road. Discussion on Pukema Road focused on the corner near the Amnicon River, where erosion along the riverbank remains a concern. The board discussed adjusting the roadway alignment to initiate the turn earlier and farther from the riverbank, thereby reducing future erosion and roadway damage. The board then toured River Road West from Hwy 13 up to the windmill, then back to Hwy 13. Discussion included road surface conditions, grading needs, ditching, brushing, culverts, drainage concerns, and shoulder maintenance. Additional roads inspected during the survey included 22 Road, Moonshine Road, Corner with Hwy P, Barton Creek Road, Ritzen Road, Pine Central Road, Peterson Road, Halkett Road, Poplar River Road, and other town roads brought up in discussion, including Amnicon River Road, Bartholomew Road, and several others. Discussion throughout the survey included:

- \* Gravel needs
- \* Culvert replacement and drainage improvements
- \* Shoulder repair and ditch maintenance
- \* Beaver activity affecting drainage systems
- \* Brushing and tree removal within the town right-of-way
- \* Erosion concerns near bridges and waterways
- \* Future grading and maintenance priorities
- \* Bridge and roadway runoff concerns

The board discussed several areas where brushing and ditching work would improve visibility, drainage, and winter maintenance operations. The board also discussed culvert replacements and erosion control projects.

At approximately 10:40 a.m., the board returned to the Town Hall for discussion of the Town Hall roof. Supervisor Mary Peterson joined the meeting at that time.

A discussion was held regarding the condition of the Town Hall roof and possible repair or replacement options. Motion by Chairperson Gary Peterson, seconded by Supervisor Mary Peterson, to proceed with the replacement bid from Northland Buildings. Motion carried.

Discussion continued on the building entrances, including a larger area and concrete slab for the public entrance.

Motion by Chairperson Gary Peterson, seconded by Supervisor Mary Peterson, to adjourn. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 11:02 a.m.
